Exodus 22:27 ... When they cry out to me, I will hear, for I am compassionate. God's name - El Rachum - The God of Compassion, the Merciful God. What is Compassion?

Compassion comes from the Latin word 'cum' and 'pati', together means, "to suffer with".

Isaiah 42:18-20 - "Hear, you deaf; look, you blind, and see! Who is blind but my servant, and deaf like the messenger I send? Who is blind like the one in covenant with me, blind like the servant of the Lord? You have seen many things, but you pay no attention; your ears are open, but you do not listen."

The Truth We Can't Ignore

Philippians 3:10 – I want to know Christ and the power of his resurrection and the fellowship of sharing in his sufferings, becoming like Him in his death, and so, somehow, to attain to the resurrection from the dead.

Henri Nouwen in his book Compassion says:

"Jesus is neither a spiritual giant nor a superstar whose compassion makes us jealous and creates in us the competitive desire to get as far, high, or deep as he did. No, Jesus is the obedient servant who hears the call and desires to respond even when it leads him to pain and suffering. This desire is not to experience pain, but to give his full undivided attention to the voice of his beloved Father."
